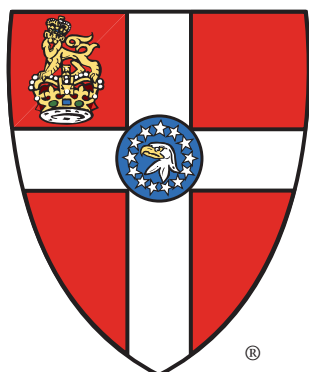

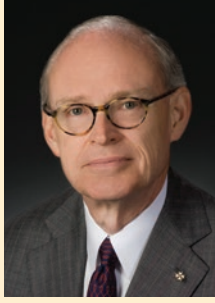

Dear Confrères,

In June of last year, I was honored to become your Prior. The last 11 months have been both busy and gratifying.

As you will see, I have reduced the 2014 Annual Report substantially from a very attractive publication to one that truly is directed to numbers. I made this decision for several reasons. First, rather than spending money on a publication, I thought the funds thereby saved could be used to better support St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital Group. Second, I confess that I rarely read annual reports that I receive. On the other hand, I do read newsletters rather carefully. Hence, I thought it would be better to emphasize the splendid newsletter that Karen Lamb, CStJ, National Communications Chair, produces for our Priory. But I welcome contrary opinion, and, if there is a groundswell from Confrères who miss the former format of our Annual Report, I am entirely open to hearing from you. Enough housekeeping, let me turn to the substance of this report. I am delighted to inform you that the Priory sent gifts totaling \$1,515,562 to the Eye Hospital Group, a record amount. This includes \$490,000 for the Eye Hospital Group from the \$900,000 USAID/ASHA grant awarded in 2013.

Without your faithful Oblation, however, we could not achieve this level of success. Each of us, when we entered the Order, pledged to provide annual Oblations, and we count on our members honoring this obligation. So, let me give you, once again, my heartfelt thanks for all you do to permit us to fulfill our sacred mission.

St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital was established in 1882 and continues to provide the highest quality ophthalmic care to the people of East Jerusalem, the West Bank and the Gaza Strip, irrespective of race, gender, creed, or ability to pay. In 1992, the Hospital opened the Gaza Clinic. In November 2005, the Hebron Eye Centre opened, and is located about 20 miles south of Jerusalem. In July 2008, the Hebron Eye Centre was upgraded to Hospital Status. In April 2007, the Anabta Eye Centre opened near Nablus, about 56 miles north of Jerusalem. Together, with the Mobile Outreach Program in the West Bank, they form St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital Group.



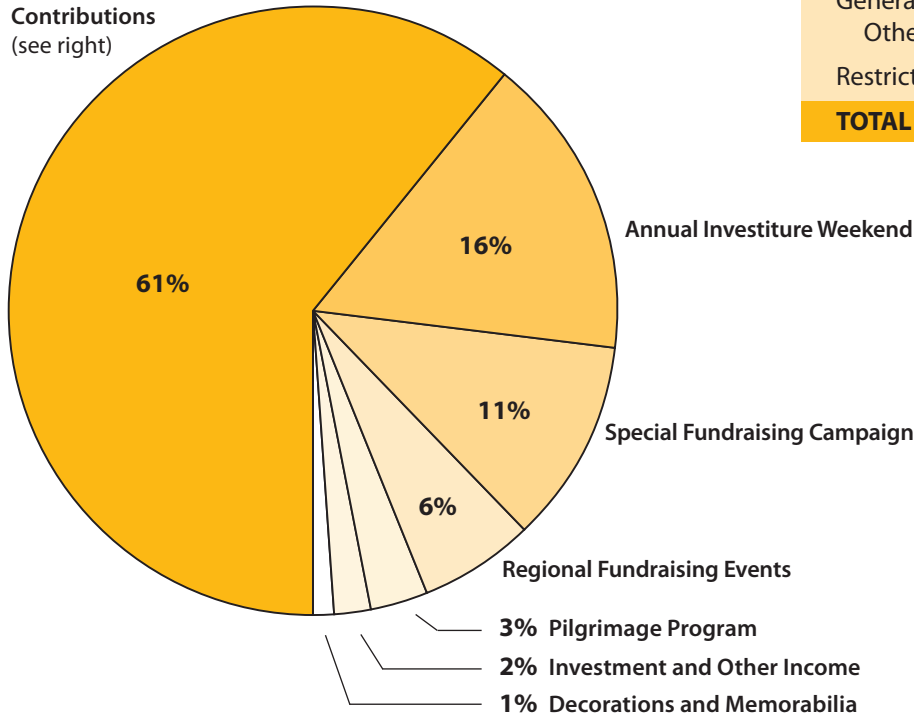

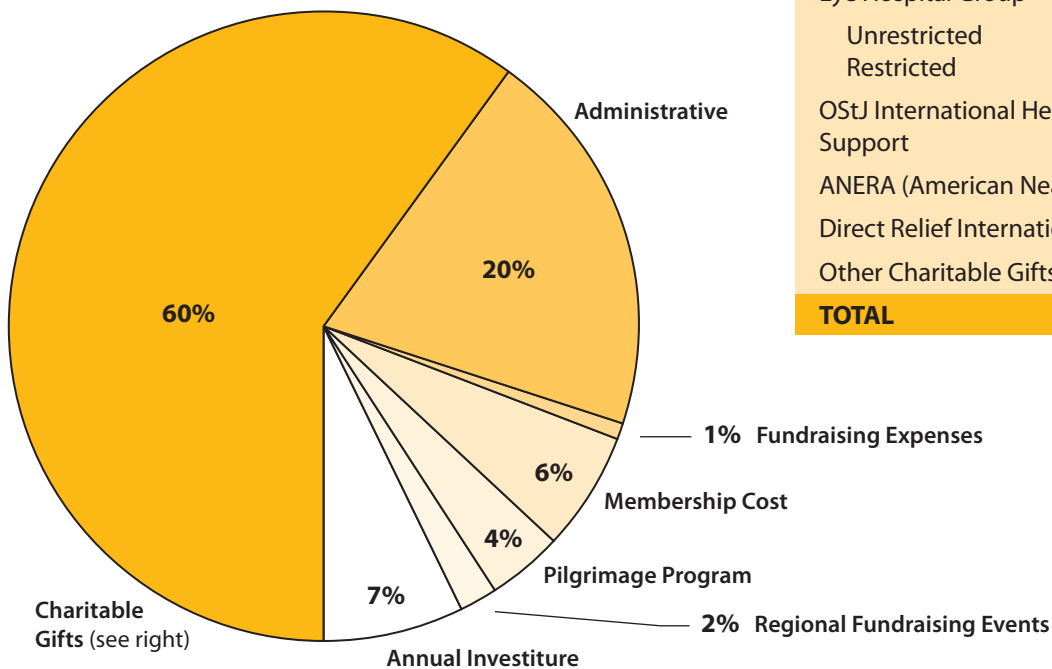

Report of the Treasurer

For the year ended December 31, 2014, the Priory sent a record \$1,515,562 of financial support to St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital Group.

Total Priory income for the year was \$3,053,852, an increase of over \$1 million compared to the previous year. The difference in revenues is primarily due to the London Mansion House Gala, which generated over \$350,000 for the Hospital Group, and the first payment of \$490,000 from the USAID/ASHA grant. Of the total, over \$1,900,000 was contributions and unrestricted program support, a \$605,247 increase over 2013.

As mentioned previously, we received and sent \$490,000 of the \$899,950 grant awarded by ASHA (American Schools and Hospitals Abroad), an agency within USAID, for the purchase of equipment at the Hospital. The remaining funds are to be sent to the Hospital in early 2015.

The Priory's annual gift to the Hospital Group and additional contributions to support operations totaled \$1,515,562, up from \$862,655 given the previous year. Additionally, over \$114,000 was contributed to support the International Order and other small partner charities, up from \$104,000 the previous year.

As mentioned in 2011, the Priory received a multi-year grant for Hospital support from an anonymous contributor

for \$250,000, and the final payment of \$50,000 was received and sent to the Hospital Group last year. Additionally, almost \$85,000 was received from various foundations and ecumenical groups for the Hospital.

The Priory's administrative expenses increased \$32,000 over the previous year largely due to the May 2013 move to larger office space and the six-month rent abatement received in 2013.

The tradition of Host Committees securing underwriting for specific costs of the Investiture and regional events continued again in 2014. The Investiture weekend generated net revenue of almost \$315,000; this includes \$20,532 contributed from various regions for medical procedures at the Hospital and \$52,650 in proceeds from the sale of art by Jill Hooper, MStJ, to support Hospital activities. Regional events generated net revenue of \$113,000 last year.

Combining these operating results with a positive change in our investment portfolio of \$200,368, the Priory ended the year with net assets of \$2,471,637, an increase of \$538,865 from the previous year.

Donated services in support of Investiture and regional events valued at \$332,209 and \$25,346 were received in 2014 and 2013.

The Priory in the USA of the Order of St John, established in 1957, is a tax-exempt charitable entity, one of eleven international Priories of The Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of St John of Jerusalem (Order of St John), headquartered in London, England. The primary mission of the Priory in the United States of America, headquartered in Washington, DC, is to raise funds for St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital Group.

The Priory's 2014 financial statements were audited by an independent firm of CPAs and received an unmodified (clean) opinion. 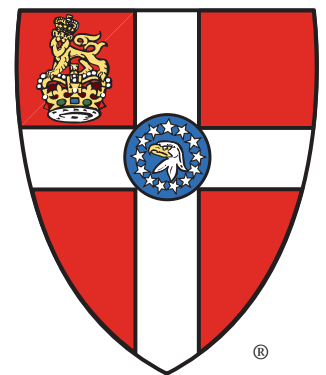
